North Carolina Lung Association Relocates Office to Better Serve the Triangle *Grant Enables Move to North Raleigh Health Park*

RALEIGH, NC [March 26, 2009] – The [American Lung Association in North Carolina](http://www.lungnc.org) is moving to a new location in Raleigh: the American Institute of Healthcare and Fitness.

The [integrated healthcare facility](#) in North Raleigh is already home to a variety of health and wellness providers, along with a fitness center, pharmacy and cafe. The Lung Association’s move to 8300 Health Park will provide building visitors with easy access to information and programs that help with managing asthma, quitting smoking, and living with lung disease.

“This has been a vision of ours for many years,” said Deborah Bryan, the North Carolina State Executive for the Lung Association. “We are excited to join the American Institute of Healthcare and Fitness, and we look forward to serving more people and forging new partnerships.”

The new location’s offerings, such as shared conference space, will assist the American Lung Association in keeping administrative costs low during these difficult economic times. This will assist us to ensure that more of our resources will go directly into the community.

“Managing our donors’ contributions responsibly is one of our top priorities,” Bryan said. “The move to North Raleigh will ultimately enable us to make a greater impact in our fight for healthy lungs and clean air.”
